




## Social Circles Evaluation Report



## Then Create Report

This displays the overall average and the average Social Circles scores for each charity. (Note: the data used here is just test data)

Each charity where data has been entered is listed one below the other, based on the Social Circles score (the Relationship Score)

A relationship score will be derived from these circles, by counting the number of people in each circle, and multiplying the number by 4 for "people who care about me", 3 for "people I can talk about anything with", 2 for "people I really like being with" and 1 for "people I talk to and play games with".



Below the bar charts the details are displayed:

- The total number of people in each Circle across the agency
- The average score by agency and overall for each circle
